

Study Questions

1. To learn who God is - what is extremely important?

You must open your heart. Your heart is the door through which God will enter so you can understand who He is. God cannot reveal Himself to you if your heart is closed. If you seek Him with all your heart He promises you that you will find Him. 2

2. God told us He was coming to live among us hundreds of years before He actually came. What are some of the things that He foretold in the Old Testament?

- He told us He would be coming to live among us.^{3 4}
- He told us He would be born of a virgin and His name would be Immanuel, Prince of Peace, Wonderful Counselor, and Mighty God.^{5 6}

- He told us He came to give His life for many.²⁶
- He told one of his followers (Peter) that he would deny Him three times before it actually happened.
- He told one of his followers (Judas) that he would betray Him before it actually happened.^{28 29}
- He told His followers that He would be condemned to death and that He would be mocked, flogged, beaten, spit upon, and killed. He told his followers that after all of this happened He would rise from the dead after three days. 30 31 32 33 34 35 36 37 38 39

- He told us that His death would begin a new covenant for all people.
- He told us that for those who believe in Him their sins would be forgiven⁴¹ and they will find life.⁴²
- After He rose from the dead He told us that He had defeated Satan and that unless He left the earth God's Holy Spirit couldn't come to live within us.⁴³

4. Why did God need to live among us?

God sent his Son, Jesus, to live among us because no matter who we are, or what we have done, God has incredible love for each and every one of us.

For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him. John 3:16-17

God's desire was, and continues to be, to deliver His truth in a world full of untruths. Because He knew we would sin, He knew we would be in need of a redeemer. He also knew that we could never redeem ourselves. No person with any amount of sin could qualify to redeem us with his life. This would be a sinful man trying to redeem a sinful man - and this equation just doesn't work. It had to be a person without sin - and no human could ever qualify.

In the Bible darkness is representative of sin and judgment.⁴⁴ Sin in our life darkens our understanding and knocks us out of alignment with God's will. It is like hitting a pothole while driving a car. We all hit potholes (i.e., we all sin), and every time we hit a pothole our internal steering is knocked out of alignment with God's will. If we hit a pothole that is really deep it can cause serious problems, possible injury, and even death.

5. What is God's message associated with? And why?

We all know what light is. We depend on light when we are in the dark so we don't stumble. This is why God's message is associated with light⁴⁵ because it provides a direction and a way out of a dark world. Jesus came to earth so we don't need to live in darkness. He came so we can have life - and live it more abundantly.⁴⁶ And when we live according to His truth we can also shine God's light⁴⁷ toward others who are driving toward potholes - so they can see and avoid problems that are ahead of them as well.

⁴⁰ Isaiah 42:6 I am the LORD, I have called You in righteousness, I will also hold You by the hand and watch over You, and I will appoint You as a covenant to the people, as a light to the nations, ⁷ to open blind eyes, to bring out prisoners from the dungeon and those who dwell in darkness from the prison.

⁴¹ Acts 13:38 Therefore let it be known to you, brethren, that through Him forgiveness of sins is proclaimed to you, ³⁹ and through Him everyone who believes is freed from all things, from which you could not be freed through the Law of Moses.

Proverbs 8:35 "For he who finds me finds life and obtains favor from the LORD. 36 "But he who sins against me injures himself; all those who hate me love death."

6. Does God love you even if you don't love Him?

Do you know that God loves you even when you don't love Him?⁴⁸ God is at work in your life even if you don't know Him or love Him.

Not wanting to learn who God is can result in a spiritual death which will create a separation from the One who created you. If you are indifferent about God (i.e., you choose to ignore Him), or if you choose to actively oppose Him (i.e., you deny Him), both of these will result in a separation from God and you will never learn His plan for your life.

If we accept God and His Word we will begin to gain the wisdom and knowledge that He wishes for each of us. 49 It's a free gift - but we must accept His gift. We must invite Him into our heart so He can reveal Himself to us.

7. What does Satan want? What tactics does Satan use?

Satan does not want you to learn God's plan for your life and the inheritance God has for you. ⁵⁰ Satan is opposed to God's plan and he wants everyone who has been created in God's image to be destroyed. ⁵¹ ⁵²

Satan would prefer to destroy God, but he can't, so next in line is you and me. Satan knows that if he can destroy you and me he can make God very sad - and Satan is working overtime to do just that. Simply turn on the news and you will see how successful he is. Someday Satan and all of his minions will be vanquished, but for now he has free reign and he is destroying people at a record pace. But it doesn't need to be this way; we simply need to learn his tricks. We need to become wise to his deceptions, and we need to learn how to avoid Satan's potholes that are meant to hurt us.

One of Satan's spirits, a fallen angel, even interrupted Jesus once as Jesus was preaching in a synagogue. ⁵³ If the devil will attempt to interrupt Jesus in a synagogue, he will certainly attempt to interrupt you as you attempt to learn God's will for your life. So be on guard. We must all learn to recognize God's voice the same way we recognize a friend's voice.

⁴⁸ 1 John 4:10 In this is love, not that we loved God, but that he loved us, and sent his Son as the atoning sacrifice.

⁴⁹ Proverbs 2:1 My son, if you will receive my words and treasure my commandments within you, ² make your ear attentive to wisdom, incline your heart to understanding; ³ for if you cry for discernment, lift your voice for understanding; ⁴ if you seek her as silver and search for her as for hidden treasures; ⁵ then you will discern the fear of the LORD And discover the knowledge of God. ⁶ For the LORD gives wisdom; from His mouth come knowledge and understanding. ⁷ He stores up sound wisdom for the upright; He is a shield to those who walk in integrity, ⁸ guarding the paths of justice, and He preserves the way of His godly ones. ⁹ Then you will discern righteousness and justice and equity and every good course. ¹⁰ For wisdom will enter your heart and knowledge will be pleasant to your soul; ¹¹ discretion will guard you, understanding will watch over you.

8. What must I do to protect myself from Satan's many schemes?

Do you think the Lord sits by as Satan roars his messages to the world and remains silent? Not at all.⁵⁴ The Lord is constantly convicting us to testify to His truth.⁵⁵ His Word pierces our conscience. We must continue to keep watch because Satan is unrelenting. If we can recognize that certain messages do not align with the Lord's truth we will have the confidence to say "No!" to those messages. We will also have the ability to warn others about Satan's many schemes as well.

In trying to recognize the Lord's voice it is important to understand that some people, even some of our closest friends, can cause interference. Actually, it's more like static. The static can be so bad it can drown out God's Word. It is absolutely critical that we learn what sin is, especially sin in our own lives. We must be able to clear away the static. We must be willing to talk with people who are willing to talk about sin, and sin for what it is: a violation of God's standards.

So we need to watch out for static in our lives, which might include some of our friends. Sin is a sin and none of our friends' static (i.e., their opinions) can change that. Don't let your friends' static try to convince you that it is okay because "everybody else is doing it." It isn't. It's a violation of God's standards. Read the instruction manual. The instruction manual doesn't change.

9. Who has been given control of the world in which we live?

God has given Satan control of the world until the end times⁵⁶ ⁵⁷ at which time Satan will be vanquished and sent to hell for eternity. But until that time we must become wise and our minds must be transformed⁵⁸ so we can recognize Satan's many deceptions. Remember, Satan is constantly looking for people to devour.⁵⁹ He is so cunning he even attempts to deceive teachers of the Bible.⁶⁰ But God promises us that He will instruct us and guide us⁶¹ and He will lead us in the right direction - around the potholes - if we follow Him. This will require that we study His Word so we can make decisions that are compatible with and in alignment with His will.

10. What are some things that God wants us to know?

Here are some things that God wants you to know:

- He will give you wisdom if you ask and believe that He will give it to you.⁶²
- He has a plan for you.⁶³
- o God's will is that you have a relationship with Him through His Son. 64
- Honor God and believe in Him so He can reveal Himself to you.

As you hear God's voice and follow Him, constantly ask Him to evaluate your motives. You must be willing to change direction as He leads you. 66

James 1:5 But if any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all liberally and without reproach; and it will be given to him.

⁶³ Jeremiah 29:11 For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. ¹² Then you will call on me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. ¹³ You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart.

Chapter 2: I was made – in God's image

Study Questions

1. Who was around when the universe was created? When the earth was created? When mankind was created?

In the beginning, God said "Let us make mankind in our image." Did you ever notice the word "our" in this verse? Who you do think "our" is? This will be explained in more detail a little later but "our" is (1) God the Father, (2) God's Son, Jesus, and (3) God's Holy Spirit.

So when God said "Let us make mankind in our image" - this means God the Father, Jesus, and God's Holy Spirit were <u>all</u> present when mankind was created. Es Yes, even Jesus was there. Jesus was there when the universe was created, and Jesus was there when the earth began. And yes, Jesus was there when a plan was put in place at the beginning of time to defeat evil and sin.

God knew what He was doing. His plan was already in place when man sinned in the Garden of Eden - and Jesus was central to that plan.

⁶⁷ Genesis 1:26 God said, "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness: and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the birds of the sky, and over the livestock, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth." 27 God created man in his own image. In God's image he created him; male and female he created them.

⁶⁸ Genesis 2:7 Then the LORD God formed man of dust from the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living being. 8 The LORD God planted a garden toward the east, in Eden; and there He placed the man whom He had formed. 9 Out of the ground the LORD God caused to grow every tree that is pleasing to the sight and good for food; the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

2. What type of creation are we?

The Bible says we all carry the image of God within us. Look closely in the mirror for a moment. Can you even begin to comprehend how complex you are? You are not the result of a spontaneous reorganization of molecules, or a close cousin of animals. You are a creation that is great and wonderfully made⁷¹ - the most excellent of all of God's creations and a special expression of His divine nature.⁷² You are an incredibly complex and exquisite piece of art that is a direct gift from God. God knew you before you were born and He predestined you to be created in the likeness of His Son, Jesus.⁷³

But this doesn't mean that we, as humans, have any of God's unlimited characteristics, such as omnipotence, omnipresence, or omniscience. We are limited in our capabilities but we do have God's likeness in many areas

3. How am I "like" God?

1. Spirit

God is Spirit⁷⁴ - which means God is invisible. When the Bible says that we are created in God's image it means we have been given a spirit. It does not mean that God is a physical being, or that we are like God in physical form. Did you know that your body is just a temporary "dwelling" place in which the real you - your soul and your spirit - resides? God created your human body for your soul to exist until such time that your physical body dies.

2. Heart - Your Feelings and Emotions

God placed something else in your soul when He created you. He gave you a heart. We are not talking about the heart that pumps blood. We are talking about the heart that gives you the ability to feel: your emotions, your thoughts, and your beliefs. God gave you a heart so you can feel love, and compassion, as well as hundreds of other emotions. He has given you these feelings so you can better know Him and understand Him.

God wants you to understand the very intentions of His heart. God gave you the capacity to feel the same emotions that He feels. God wants you to love what He loves, and hate what He hates. God wants you to love Him with all your heart, mind, and soul.⁷⁵ That is why He created you in His own image, and that is also why He gave you a heart.

3. Relationships and Fellowship

Our Creator also created you to have a relationship with Him. God wants to have a rich and meaningful relationship with every one of His creations. The great news is, we can - if we choose to. But God will never force this relationship. He will never force His way into your heart. If He forces His way in, it won't be a relationship. When He knocks on your door (of your heart) He is hoping you will let Him in so He can tell you where you are going. He has a wonderful trip planned. But, unless you open the door of your heart you will never learn where His trip will take you. It's a destination you won't want to miss.

4. Free Will

God permits everyone to choose their own path and to make their own decisions. This is called free will. Just like the angels, we all possess free will. We can follow God's path (i.e., God's rules, meant to protect us), or we can follow our own path. If we don't follow God's path don't expect His protection. He will let you reap what you sow.

5. Conscience and Knowledge

You have been endowed with an intellect that is far superior to any animal, and you have also been given a mind that is capable of understanding. But where God's knowledge is unlimited,⁷⁶ ⁷⁷ you are limited in your knowledge.⁷⁸ While animals act primarily on instinct, you are capable of looking beyond your needs. The Bible says that we all have knowledge of right and wrong implanted in our hearts.⁷⁹ Perhaps our ability to

6. Creativity

Just look around. Look at all that God has created on earth, in the sea, and in the heavens above. 80 81 82 83 Also look around and see all of the incredible things that humans have created. It is quite obvious that humans are incredibly creative.

7. Wisdom

Wisdom is a characteristic that both God and man possess. Theologians usually use the term "omniscient" when speaking of God's infinite knowledge. God knows everything about everything. He knows what we are thinking, so and He knows everything that will happen. God cannot devise a bad plan because He knows the answer. His omniscience supports His wisdom. God also gives us wisdom, the wisdom of God and the wisdom of man is not the same. In fact, they are incompatible with each other. True wisdom does not come from man, it comes from God.

God, through His wisdom, will bring about what He has promised in ways that you and I cannot even imagine. But you must follow Him to learn what that is. If you lack wisdom you can ask God for it. Wisdom, if used properly, can ensure moral goodness, and it can also be a guiding light for your life. Wisdom will steer you clear of Satan's potholes. Having true wisdom is not knowing about good and evil, it is knowing good *from* evil. Wisdom is about making proper choices. Believing in God, and Jesus, can be the beginning of your wisdom.

Psalms 147:5 Great is our Lord, and mighty in power. His understanding is infinite.

8. Sovereign / Authority

We are also "like God" in the sense that we have sovereign authority. God has sovereign authority over the universe, and we have been given sovereign authority over the world in which we live. ⁹³ ⁹⁴ This sovereign authority, however, is not a birthright. It is a gift from God. ⁹⁵ Just as God created and formed our world to His liking, we are now responsible for managing it. This is a responsibility that has been entrusted to us and we should not take it for granted. We will someday answer to God for the condition we leave it in.

9. Eternal Being

God is eternal⁹⁶ and the spirit within us is also eternal. If you haven't looked up the word "eternal" in the dictionary lately - it means "without a beginning, and without an end." Being eternal means it will last forever. The important question for all of us is: after our physical body dies will we live eternally in heaven, ⁹⁷ or eternally in hell? ⁹⁸ 99 100 101 Eternity is a very long time.

4. Am I unique? And, does God really know everything about me?

Yes, you are different. You are very different from every other person who has ever lived. It was God's plan from the very beginning that all of His creations would inhabit the earth ¹⁰² and that every person would be unique and fearfully and wonderfully made. ¹⁰³ You weren't born by accident. God knit you together in your mother's womb. ¹⁰⁴

From the very beginning God wanted you to be unique - while giving you some of the attributes and characteristics of your parents. That is why you may have some of your parent's physical features, and maybe even some of their behaviors, both good and bad.

When God created you He broke the mold. There is no other person on earth just like you. You are a "one and only." It says in the Bible that we were the clay and God was the potter. 105 106 We were formed in His hand for a special purpose 107 which someday will be revealed. God was involved in your physical and psychological formation from the very beginning. He knows how many days you will live, and He knows all of the experiences that you will go through during your lifetime. He has a plan for you - a glorious plan. But you must believe. He can't reveal Himself to you, and He can't reveal His plan for you, 108 unless you open your heart and let Him in.

5. What does the Lord want to give me?

When you begin to understand that God designed you for a special purpose, and that His will is perfect, you will begin to understand that the unique gifts He has given you are meant to bless you. And when you delight in the gifts that God has given you He will give you the desires of your heart. And when you have the right desires, He will fulfill those desires. It's a win-win. If we focus on the gifts the Lord has given us we can be content and we will no longer desire what others have. We won't need anything - except God. This is the Lord's plan for each of us. So be grateful for your uniqueness. Cherish your uniqueness. Don't try to be like others. It would be a very boring world indeed if God made us all alike.

6. When did the Lord put His plan in place for me?

Did you know that God put a plan in place for you and your life before the earth was formed?¹¹¹ He also predestined you eons ago to live the life that you are living.¹¹⁴ His plan might include taking you over some bumpy roads in the bus that He is driving, but each of these bumpy roads has a purpose. They are for our spiritual development. You might be riding over some bumpy roads right now.

Riding over bumpy roads might be something that God feels that you need to experience. He might want you to see something, or feel something, or maybe experience something. It might include experiencing hardship. It might include experiencing pain, or loss. It might include experiencing His grace, possibly even a miracle. But it's all for a reason. God came and lived with us so we can believe in Him and trust in Him with our life and our future. Following Him requires faith, and with just a little bit of faith He promises us that nothing will be impossible for us. 115

7. Did God create me this way (the way I am...) for a reason?

In God's eyes we have all been created just the way He wants us. We are all wonderfully made and His treasured possession. He has a plan for every single one of us. This means there is a special work that God has planned for you that only you can do, in just the way you can do it. There is nothing in your life that will be wasted. God uses your past, your present, and all of the hardships that you have been through to prepare you for the future. Ask God for wisdom to help you understand why He made you the way you are and why He placed you on this earth so you can be effective in your work for Him. He has a beautiful plan for you. You were created for Him to do good works.

Chapter 3: I was made – to live through many difficulties

Study Questions

1. Was I born a sinner?

God didn't create man to sin. God created man upright. He ability to make our own decisions. This means we can make decisions that align with God's standards, or we can make decisions that do not align with God's standards, also known as sin. And He has given us the ability to choose. This means that God has given us the ability to ignore Him, and even deny Him. But the great thing is, it's our choice.

Who doesn't like having 100% control over our own decisions? Yahoo! It's like putting a child in a candy store and then leaving. Well, this is exactly what God has given each of us - total control over our decisions. To make matters worse, He has left the candy store owner (Satan) in the store to convince the child (us) to eat as much candy as we want. And being as naïve as we are, and if we don't take our parent's warnings seriously, we will listen to the candy store owner. The candy looks so good, how can it possibly hurt us? Satan will also work overtime convincing you that the candy is healthy for you. Oh boy, this is bad.

When God created us He knew the only way He could ever have a relationship with us was to give us the option of having a relationship with Him, and the option of listening to Him, otherwise it wouldn't be a relationship. Love is not love if it is in any way coerced. So, God permits all of us to choose our own path even if it means we choose not to follow Him.

¹¹⁹ Ecclesiastes 7:29 Behold, this only have I found: that God made man upright.

Sin entered the world through one man, which was Adam, and has been passed down through the generations to every one of us. 120 We all inherited this sin nature at birth. 121 122 This sin nature is the basis for our sinful thoughts and our sinful habits. Sin has its roots in our heart, which influences our mind, which eventually finds its expression through our body when we follow through with our sinful desire. 123 124 Every time we sin we fall short of God's standards for our life. 125

2. How can I prove that I inherited a sin nature at birth?

It is relatively easy to prove that we all inherited a sin nature. ¹²⁶ Just watch any small child. The child is naturally selfish and there was nobody who had to teach the child to be selfish. Being selfish is how we all started out. It is basically in our DNA. ¹²⁷ Having a sin nature is a condition that we all inherited.

As the child begins to grow up he begins to learn right from wrong and that selfishness is not a great way to live. The child learns, sometimes the hard way, that people will get hurt if he continues along his selfish ways. He learns that it causes problems. He eventually learns to control his selfish desires and that sharing is a better way to live - for everyone. This is when his character starts to develop. He starts making conscious decisions about how he wishes to live: to share, or not share.

As he continues to grow and interact with others he is confronted with even more important choices - to do things that are right, or wrong, with kindness, or with evil - and this is when sin enters the picture. He now has to make decisions that align with God's standards, ¹²⁸ or is contrary to God's standards, which is sin.

As we grow older we also learn about personal responsibility and accountability for our decisions. We learn, sometimes the hard way, that our decisions can have a very high price, such as contracting a disease, going to jail, drinking and getting into a car accident, and sometimes even death. As we approach adulthood we begin to learn that our decisions can have an everlasting consequence.

¹²⁰ Romans 5:12 Therefore, as sin entered into the world through one man, and death through sin; and so death passed to all men, because all sinned. 13 For until the law, sin was in the world; but sin is not charged when there is no law. 14 Nevertheless death reigned from Adam until Moses, even over those whose sins weren't like Adam's disobedience, who is a foreshadowing of him who was to come.

¹²¹ Genesis 8:21 because the imagination of man's heart is evil from his youth.

¹²² Psalms 51:5 Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity. In sin my mother conceived me.

3. Can God prevent my suffering?

Yes, God can prevent your pain and suffering. He's God, remember? But God allows pain and suffering because He wants you to lean on Him. We are all hard-wired to call out to God when we feel anguish, or sorrow, or despair. If you have ever ridden on an extremely bumpy plane ride you know exactly how it feels. You grab the armrest, or the person next to you, and you pray. You pray for deliverance.

He could have stopped His own suffering and His death, but He didn't. He had to die for you and me. This was all part of His grand plan - which He foretold to us through His prophets in the Old Testament. ¹²⁹ It was His reason for coming. It was His plan from the very beginning. He knew that sin would rule the world ¹³⁰ and He knew that there was no other way to save us from our sins. The very moment that Adam sinned in the Garden He knew that He would need to come to earth and die for us. He loves us that much. If God didn't know that Adam would sin, and Lucifer would rebel, then God made a mistake. But God doesn't make mistakes. He knew what would happen by giving us free will, and He knew He would need to save us from our sins.

So, God can definitely empathize with your suffering. He suffered ¹³¹ and died for you so that you, if you believe in Him, can live with Him for eternity. ¹³² If you don't believe in Him - well, your eternal destiny will be far worse. ¹³³

4. Why do I need to suffer?

God can, with His infinite powers, save you. He can turn every bumpy ride that you experience in your life into something very good. ¹³⁴ He knows that a bumpy ride will draw you closer to Him. And as we all know, pain and suffering happen all the time. When we have faith in God He can turn all of our poor choices, and even our pain and suffering, into something very good. It is through our pain that we find Him.

Just as a loving parent might need to allow a child to suffer through the consequences of their bad decisions, God must allow us to suffer through the consequences of our bad decisions. Unfortunately, this includes suffering through the consequences of what others do as well. We might not understand the lessons that God is teaching us at the time, but the painful consequences that we experience might result in a life changing event. And, in God's plan, life-changes are good - especially those that are created from pain. He wants us to be transformed by the renewing of our mind. ¹³⁵ God desires that we all change so He can use us.

This means God allows us to experience problems and difficulties in our life 136 137 so we will grow closer to Him. He needs us to be transformed into His way of thinking so He can use us and bless us. When we start to understand His will for our life this is when we can begin to understand why we were born and what our purpose is.

There is a true miracle in our suffering. God's sovereignty and His plan for each of us will use our difficulties and our suffering to strengthen our faith in Him. Our trials and our suffering is the means by which our faith is proven. So, basically, our difficulties and our suffering is the means by which God perfects, strengthens, and molds us into the creation that He can use strengthen which will make us steadfast and able to withstand Satan's many

schemes. The very same trials that Satan puts you through to destroy you, God uses for your deliverance and your development. 140

God tells us that He can use every bad experience that the evil one creates - and God can create something good out of it 141 142 if we follow Him. This should give you great hope for whatever you are going through. This is so important we will repeat it: God can use every bad experience that the evil one has created in your life and He can turn it into something extremely good 143 144 if you follow Him.

5. Does Satan have any power over me?

Satan has no real power over any of us other than to deceive us - but in this area he is extremely good. He can't physically hurt us, and he can't make us "do" anything, but he can whisper in our ear. He is so good we sometimes don't even realize that his lies are designed to hurt us - because everything he wants us to do is based on our human weaknesses and our human desires. He knows exactly where we are the weakest.

So we listen to him, and we believe his lies, and then afterward we realize we were duped - again. If we continue to let our desires run unchecked we will continue to inherit the consequences of trouble, hurt, pain, suffering, broken relationships, and so much more. Take a moment and connect the dots. Many of our problems are the result of not listening to God's voice and His teachings. We ignore God's warning beacons and we drive right into the potholes that are in front of us. And sometimes the potholes are very deep, and it hurts - a lot.

6. Does God ever test me? Does He tempt me?

God tests us¹⁴⁵ but He never tempts us.¹⁴⁶ We are tempted when we are dragged away by our own evil desires.¹⁴⁷ Jesus teaches us that sin begins with us.¹⁴⁸

Did you know that God allows Satan and his servants to tempt you? God could stop Satan in a second if He wanted to (He's God, remember?), but allowing Satan to tempt you is all part of His grand plan to build your faith in Him. God has total control over Satan and God could prevent Satan and his servants from tempting you if He wanted to. The Bible teaches us that at least some of Satan's requests to tempt you actually pass through Jesus first - and Jesus must say "Yes" to Satan's request. However, God promises to never allow Satan to tempt you in a way that is beyond your capability. During the Last Supper when Jesus told His disciples where He was going (i.e., to be crucified), Jesus told Peter that Satan had made a request to sift him as wheat. Sifting in this situation means Satan put in a request to test Peter. This means that some, and maybe all, of Satan's

requests to tempt you might pass through Jesus first. The reason Jesus allows this is to see if you can resist the temptation to prove your faith in Him.

As this is happening Jesus will pray that your faith will not fail, just as Jesus told Peter that He had prayed for him that his faith would not fail. ¹⁵³ So, even if we aren't sure whether Satan asks Jesus to tempt us specifically - we should know that Satan does wish to attack us and sift us as wheat. This means we might be tested by many trials to determine if our faith is genuine.

Do you sometimes feel as though you are being sifted by Satan? Perhaps Satan has been given permission by Jesus to sift you as wheat. Is your faith strong enough to survive such a test?

7. How does God want me to feel when I am being tested and I face trials?

Everyone finds it hard to be joyful when they are being sifted as wheat. But God tells us to consider it pure joy whenever we face trials 154 - as the trials will test our faith, and the testing of our faith will develop perseverance, and perseverance must finish its work so we may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing. 155

It is precisely when you place your faith in Jesus that you will be tested and you will face trials - so get ready. Who do you think Satan wants to test? Do you think Satan wants to sift those who do not believe in God and haven't put their faith in Jesus? Not at all. He already has these people. Satan wishes to test and attack those who are still learning to put their faith in Jesus. Satan still has a shot at winning these people over to their human desires so he can deceive and destroy them.

So, here is an important learning moment so please take note. We are to consider it pure joy when we are being tested. ¹⁵⁶ Jesus might allow Satan to sift you in order to test your faith. And because you now understand how this works - you will win the fight because you now understand how the game is played. But, be ready. If Satan asks Jesus if he can sift you and if Jesus says "Yes" and then prays for your faith, this is when your trials could become extremely difficult. Hang on tight as it could become a very bumpy ride. But as soon as you learn to put your trust in God, and when Satan sees your new-found faith in God, Satan will learn that you are not one who can be easily deceived - so he will spend less time on you. Life will get easier. Resist the devil and he will flee from you. ¹⁵⁷

8. What are two of Satan's key deceptions?

Pride.

You have to be especially on guard when things are going well for you. When things are going well Satan will try to deceive you into believing that you don't need God. You might be at a point in your life when things are going really well. You might be having a run of success with your family, your job, your finances, your friends, and during these times Satan will do whatever he can to puff you up and make you feel prideful by convincing you that you are having all of this success based on YOU and that you don't need God.

When things aren't going so well Satan will use his cunning and he will use the reverse ploy. He will deceive you into doubt and unbelief. His message during difficult times is that God has abandoned you. He will try to convince you that God can't be with you and that God can't possibly care for you because godly people should never suffer. Satan is a master at playing with our minds and influencing the way we think. He knows how to use our human emotions against us. We need to continually test our thoughts and the spirits. Satan craves glory and he will employ whatever suffering and doubt he can to turn us away from God.

Luke 22:32 but I prayed for you, that your faith wouldn't fail.

Always remember, any feelings of inadequacy or doubt or hurt that you feel does not come from God. These feelings are coming from the one who wishes to destroy you. Be careful not to listen to anyone who assures you that when you put your trust in God that you won't suffer or have difficulties. This just isn't true. Remember, Satan's goal is to destroy you in order to bring you to hell with him. Satan already knows he is going there because he saw Jesus' victory on the cross, so he will use anything and everything in his arsenal to bring you with him.

Coveting Things and Lust.

Another of our greatest weaknesses, and one of Satan's greatest successes, is when Satan convinces us that we should have more. He will do whatever he can to convince you that others have so much, and you have so little. Satan will constantly try to make you feel unhappy with what you have. And because of our human weakness, if we're not careful we might actually believe in his lie. Having more "stuff" will never make you happy. Just ask all of the people who have won the lottery and their lives have been ruined. They have learned the hard way that money does not bring happiness.

If you listen to Satan you might be deceived into thinking that he's right. He will lead you to ask yourself: Why was I dealt such a poor hand? Why wasn't I born with more talent, better looks, a better job, and have more "things" like other people - as if having these things will make you happy. Hint: it won't. When we sin we attempt to fill our hearts with "stuff." But stuff isn't what we need - all we need is God.

9. What is the correct way to understand my suffering?

Because of the Lord's teachings you now have the ability to understand your suffering very differently:

- It will refine you and will make you stronger. 159
- It will equip you to comfort others. 160 Those who have suffered make the most effective comforters.
- It will allow you to experience God at a deeper level.
- Your suffering can be used to mature your faith. 162

10. What are the major differences between punishment and discipline?

Punishment:

- A penalty or sanction given for any crime or offense.
- The act of punishing, or the state of being punished.
- · Informal rough treatment.
- Any aversive stimulus administered to an organism as part of training.

Discipline:

- Training or conditions imposed for the improvement of physical powers, self-control, etc.
- Systematic training in obedience to regulations and authority.
- The state of improved behavior, etc., resulting from such training or conditions.
- A system of rules for behavior, methods of practice, etc.
- A branch of learning or instruction.

11. Does God punish us or discipline us?

He is not a punishing God. God never punishes you and me for the things we do.

Wouldn't God want to discipline His children, you and me? The answer is Yes, 163 and for this reason He might discipline us when we misbehave - when we "don't live according to His standards." 164 165

Because He has given us free will He simply allows us to suffer the consequences of our own decisions. We must learn that if we don't live according to His standards He can't be there to protect us. He lets us reap what we sow. ¹⁶⁶ But when we choose to live according to His standards we will reap a sure reward. ¹⁶⁸

In both the Old and New Testaments God reveals Himself as One who disciplines His children. Discipline is part and parcel of knowing God, and God has revealed to us that His discipline is similar to the way we discipline our children. We should feel blessed when God disciplines us because it means He loves us. ¹⁶⁹ ¹⁷⁰ If He didn't love us He wouldn't discipline us. Think about this for a moment. If God didn't call you His child He wouldn't even care to discipline you. You wouldn't want that.

If you are going through some difficult times in your life it could be because God is disciplining you. ¹⁷¹ Don't turn a deaf ear to His instruction. ¹⁷² God is more than willing to discipline those He loves who are not living according to His standards - just like any good parent would do. A good parent will want to guide and direct his children. God also wants to guide and direct His children. He knows that loving His children means disciplining them. ¹⁷³ God also knows that His discipline must be something that is felt and must not feel good, otherwise the discipline might be dismissed. It must get our attention and it must be something that we don't want to experience again.

Don't become discouraged when God disciplines you¹⁷⁴ but have hope in the Lord and He will renew your strength.¹⁷⁵ Don't draw back in your walk with Him. God's discipline is always perfect. It will never exceed what is needed. It will never be too harsh or too weak. His disciple is not intended to be a burden but is meant to lesson your load. It is meant to make you stronger and it will allow you to withstand the temptations that come your way.

12. What should we do when our friends give us their opinions?

It is important that we not let opinions, or hearsay, or conjecture sway our decisions. Almost none of what we hear from others will be based on God's truth. What we must all understand is that Satan does not want us to believe that there is a divine standard by which we should live our life - because Satan's goal is to keep us ignorant of God and His powers. Remember, Satan loves it when we live in ignorance. Living in ignorance means we aren't getting any closer to God. Satan is working full time on everyone, including your friends, so don't listen to your friends who give you their opinions unless it is backed by scripture. Scripture is truth; opinions are not. God's standards are meant to save. Satan's standards are meant to keep you away from God's truth. If Satan can fill you with your friends' opinions so you don't make a decision - he will surely use that approach. God's standards are based on His truth so absolute right and wrong are unaffected by human opinion. We must get answers to life's most important questions out of His instruction manual. Everyone who hears His Word and puts them into practice is like a wise man who builds his house on the rock. 176

13. Does God's definition of sin ever change?

Sin isn't sin just because we are tempted, it is a sin when we give in to a temptation and then we act it out. ¹⁷⁷ Jesus was also tempted, but He didn't sin. ¹⁷⁸ He didn't elevate His desires over God's desires. Jesus' death on the cross represented a full, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice for every sin that we have ever committed, including those that we haven't committed yet. ¹⁷⁹ But we must believe in Him to be saved; it's the only way.

Do we need to give up our sinning to be saved? No. But we need to acknowledge them for what they are. They are sins. Sins are a violation of God's standards. Be careful not to rationalize your sins and say that what you are doing isn't that bad, or that everyone else is doing it, or that God's standards are old and antiquated. God's standards never change. A sin is a sin. A sin a thousand years ago is a sin today.

Many people believe that God's standards should change to keep pace with the times. But God's moral standards never change. If something was sinful in the Old Testament it is also sinful in the New Testament. If it was sinful 2000 years ago it is sinful today. Unlike today's lawmakers God never changes His mind or alters His laws. God's standards stay firm and unaltered. They were established and will remain the same forever and ever.

14. How can I possibly live up to God's standards?

Live by the Spirit and not by the flesh. ¹⁸⁴ ¹⁸⁵ We need to listen to God's Spirit within us and heed what He says. It is only by the Spirit of God within us that we can overcome our sinful nature. We can never live up to God's standards all by ourselves. We can try but we will never be able to do it. We must understand that His commandments were created to make us aware that we are sinful. ¹⁸⁶ God's commandments were meant to convict us and make us aware that we need a Savior. Without a Savior we will go to hell. We must accept the fact that we will always have sinful thoughts, do sinful things, and that we can only be saved by believing that Jesus came to earth to die for us.

Jesus wants us to know that obeying His commandments in the Old Testament is still of utmost importance because in the New Testament He teaches us "Therefore anyone who sets aside one of the least of these commands and teaches others accordingly will be called least in the kingdom of heaven, but whoever practices and teaches these commands will be called great in the kingdom of heaven." 187

Study Questions

1. Who is in control of the earth in which we live?

When God put Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden and told them not to eat from the tree of good and evil and then Satan convinced Eve that it would be okay to eat the apple from that tree, this was Satan's first successful deception of the human race. That is when God transferred the authority of the earth over to Satan, and Satan has been deceiving us ever since.

2. What does Satan absolutely LOVE?

Satan absolutely loves it when humans live in ignorance of God. Don't tell humans about the destruction that will be left in their wake when they sin: the suffering, the sorrow, the agony, the broken relationships, and despair. And surely don't tell humans that God's protection will be removed when they sin because God is holy and He can't help sinful people (i.e., God will allow us to reap what we sow). This is pretty much the perfect scenario for Satan: let Satan deceive humans, humans listen, humans get hurt, Satan tells humans that God has abandoned them, humans not smart enough to understand why they are suffering, humans not smart enough to connect the dots. Humans live in ignorance. DON'T LET THIS HAPPEN TO YOU!

^{190 2} Corinthians 4:4 in whom the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelieving, that the light of the Good News of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God, should not dawn on them.

Revelation 17:17 For God has put in their hearts to do what he has in mind, and to be of one mind, and to give their kingdom to the beast, until the words of God should be accomplished.

3. Who was in the Garden of Eden with Adam and Eve?

We have learned that God is Spirit, and Spirits are invisible. So, who was visible and walking and talking with Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden shortly after Adam sinned? It might have been Jesus. It was probably not God the Father because of what Jesus told us. 193 194

Remember in Genesis where it says "Let us make mankind in our image." The "our" in this verse refers to (1) God the Father, (2) God's Son, Jesus, and (3) God's Holy Spirit. So when God said "Let us make mankind in our image" - they were all present when mankind was created. This means that it could have been any one of them who was with Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden. But, since it has been primarily Jesus who has been God in bodily form while on earth, it could have been Jesus who was walking and talking with Adam and Eve in the Garden. Jesus has always been God's representative on earth - appearing for Him and as Him. It is clear in scripture that Jesus and God the Father are One. 196

4. When was Jesus' rescue plan launched?

Isn't it kind of ironic that Adam and (maybe) Jesus were together in the Garden of Eden when Adam started the downfall of the human race through his sin, and (maybe) Jesus was there at the exact same moment to save the human race through His plan. Same time, same place.

These two events had to happen at the same time in the Garden otherwise God made a mistake. But God never makes a mistake. This means God knew what would happen in the Garden, and He knew that He had to have a plan in place at the moment that Adam sinned to save us from our sins. This also means that it may have been Jesus, in the Garden, who knew at the very moment that Adam sinned that He would need to die for us. At the very second that there was sin, there was a solution. At the very moment that Adam sinned - Jesus presented Himself as our Savior.

God knew what He was doing.

Jesus wouldn't defeat Satan and sin until He died on the cross, but the game was in the bag. His rescue plan had been launched. ¹⁹⁷ Jesus knew that He couldn't come to earth to be the sacrifice for our sins anytime soon - because He still needed to give us His ten commandments. And then, after He gave us His commandments, we would need hundreds of years to learn that we couldn't possibly keep His commandments. We needed to learn that we couldn't do it. The commandments needed to convict us ¹⁹⁸ and make us aware that we were doomed. We had to learn that we couldn't live without sinning and that we all deserved to go to hell. We had to learn that we needed a Savior.

¹⁹² Genesis 3:8 They heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden. 9 Then the LORD God called to the man, and said to him, "Where are you?"

5. Does God "use" Satan for His Glory?

Satan does, in fact, serve God's purpose. Satan is cunning but he isn't wise. He can't figure out how to counter God's perfect plan. Satan's effort to destroy you and me actually produces the opposite effect. God knows that people will draw closer to Him when suffering comes into their lives. Our suffering, while inflicted by Satan, is allowed by God. Because of Satan's opposition to God we will be blessed and Satan's objective to destroy us will be in vain. Through Satan's efforts to destroy us God gains a more intimate relationship with us - which is exactly what God wants.

This shows the important role that Satan plays in God's grand plan. God uses Satan and sin to achieve His ultimate purpose. The creation of Satan and his opposition to man is an important element of God's plan. Satan's power is given to him by God. God's providence is what allows Satan to do what he does. Satan has power to affect us but only by how much God allows. The fact that Adam and Eve sinned in the Garden of Eden does not mean God is the author of sin, nor does it mean that He tempted Adam and Eve to sin. He didn't. ¹⁹⁹ He simply uses Satan for His purpose.

God uses Satan to bring about His divine discipline. Satan is allowed to do only what God has planned for His glory and our good. Through Satan's opposition to God's instruction manual God's purposes are fulfilled. After we suffer from our sin and disobedience God restores us and makes us strong, firm, and steadfast.²⁰⁰ Our suffering is used to produce humility and a dependence on God.

All of this means that the harder Satan works to oppose the gospel, the more he actually promotes it. God has purposed Satan's existence and his opposition to fulfill God's grand plan. ²⁰¹ In everything that Satan does he is actually serving God.

¹⁹⁹ James 1:13 for God can't be tempted by evil, and he himself tempts no one.

²⁰⁰ 1 Peter 5:10 But may the God of all grace, who called you to his eternal glory by Christ Jesus, after you have suffered a little while, perfect, establish, strengthen, and settle you. 11 To him be the glory and the power forever and ever.

²⁰¹ Acts 26:18 to open their eyes and turn them from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan to God, so that they may receive forgiveness of sins and a place among those who are sanctified by faith in me.

6. Is God glorified by "allowing" sin in the world?

Think about it. The glory of God is actually declared by allowing sin in the world:

- Having sin in the world allows for God's mercy and His compassion. 202 203
- It allows God to show His love and His forgiveness of our sins.
- It allows God to show His righteousness and His wrath to those who deny Him.
- And, through Satan, it shows that God doesn't leave the guilty unpunished²⁰⁶ just like any good court system.

Wrath and mercy highlight God's glory and you can't have either without the fall of mankind.

God is actually glorified by condemning the guilty to hell. Our courts would not be legitimate if they didn't condemn a murderer to a long prison sentence. So our courts are glorified, they are made legitimate, by their accurate sentences of people who abuse the law. God's wrath is also justified, and God is glorified, when He provides for mans' forgiveness and man rejects it. This means that behind Satan, and all of Satan's unrighteous deeds, is a holy, righteous, and compassionate God who causes all things to work for the good of those who love Him who have been called according to his purpose.

7. Can I know God's will?

Yes, you can know God's will. In fact, God wants you to know His will. ²⁰⁸ Knowing God is why we were born. It's the nature of our existence. There is not a single one of us that just appeared on this earth without a plan and a purpose. God chose us before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in His sight. ²⁰⁹ In Him we were chosen, having been predestined according to the plan of Him who works out everything in conformity with the purpose of his will, in order that we, who were the first to put our hope in Christ, might be for the praise of His glory. ²¹⁰

But to truly know God you must repent of your sins and believe that God sent His Son, Jesus, to die for your sins. When you commit and become a believer in Jesus you are marked in Him with a seal - and God's Holy Spirit will live within you. ²¹¹ It is the Holy Spirit who will be your advocate who will help testify about God. ²¹² The Holy Spirit will also teach you all things and remind you of everything that Jesus promised. ²¹³

Numbers 14:18 The LORD is slow to anger and abundant in lovingkindness, forgiving iniquity and transgression;

Exodus 34:6 Then the LORD passed by in front of him and proclaimed, "The LORD, the LORD God, compassionate and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in lovingkindness and truth; who keeps lovingkindness for thousands, who forgives iniquity, transgression and sin; yet He will by no means leave the guilty unpunished, visiting the iniquity of fathers on the children and on the grandchildren to the third and fourth generations."

8. Can I talk to God myself? Will He listen?

The very moment that Jesus died on the cross the huge and heavy curtain that separated people from the inner sanctuary in the Jewish temple was torn top to bottom. God ripped it. With Jesus' death on the cross God's plan was complete. And for everyone who believes that this was God's ultimate plan, Jesus' death on the cross removed the human barrier that used to exist between God and man. By ripping this huge curtain God was telling us "You are no longer on the outside. My Son, Jesus, has made a way for you to have direct access to me. Come on in."

With this curtain gone you no longer need to go through anyone to reach God. No people. No rituals. No barriers. No specific building. Nothing is in the way. You can talk to God right now, right this minute, wherever you are. Remember, your heart is the door through which God will enter - but He will never force His way in. He will wait until you invite Him in. He will knock (feel your heart, He may be knocking right now), and then He will wait for you to answer. Just ask Him in. He will come in if you invite Him in.

9. Can I be found "at fault" for not learning about God?

Whether you admit it or not everyone has been created with a desire to know God. We have all been made to discover who God is and to find satisfaction and joy in Him. This is the reason why we were born. He made us all so different, in vastly different cultures, and in different nations, ²¹⁴ so we might search for Him and discover who He is. God's incredible creativity is clearly visible in everything that we see on earth, in the heavens above, and in the oceans below. Because of all that God has created, which we can see, we are without excuse in knowing who God is. ²¹⁵ For the heavens declare the glory of God. ²¹⁶

Acts 17:26 He made from one blood every nation of men to dwell on all the surface of the earth, having determined appointed seasons, and the boundaries of their dwellings, 27 that they should seek the Lord, if perhaps they might reach out for him and find him, though he is not far from each one of us. 28 'For in him we live, and move, and have our being.' 10. Will I ever see God's grand design? What must I do?

Even though we can't see God's beautiful design He has given us many of His design notes. His notes, which are scattered throughout the Bible, give us a wonderful glimpse into what the top of the rug looks like. His notes say that He will wipe away every tear from our eyes and there will be no death, or mourning, or crying, or pain, ²¹⁷ and righteousness dwells. ²¹⁸ So, through His Word, we have been given a wonderful glimpse of heaven. We won't see His beautiful design until we join Him, but when we do see His side of the rug it is going to be an awesome sight. ²¹⁹ ²²⁰ ²²¹ That is when we will finally understand what God has been up to all these years. This is when we will see how our life, including all of the trials and difficult times that we have been put through ²²² ²²³ ²²⁴ ²²⁵ have been woven into His design on the top of the rug - with Jesus as the thread. God will allow us to be included in His beautiful design on the top of the rug through our faith in Jesus. Only Jesus. Jesus is the thread and the fabric of God's beautiful design.

11. Am I (and everyone) hardwired to know that there is a God? How?

Do you believe that God had a plan, or do you believe that this is all just a great story? What are you putting your faith in? Are you putting your faith in God and His Word? Or are you putting your faith in the things that you see and hear in the world? Or, maybe you are putting your faith in you? Maybe you - is all you need. Maybe things are going so well for you that you don't need anything, or anybody, because you have everything under control, and everything is in your control.

You might even believe that there is no God - so why would you need any faith? That seems to work pretty well until someone close to you dies, or you fall off a ladder and become paralyzed, or you get cancer and have two months to live, or someone walks into your school and shoots one of your children. When these things happen we are all wired to call out to God. 226 It is the nature of our existence. Knowing there is a God is hardwired into our DNA. 227

12. With God will I "believe it when we see it?"

Because we are human we tend to put our trust and faith in things that we can see, not in things that we can't see. It is so much harder to believe in things that we can't see. We have probably all said at one time or another "I'll believe it when I see it." Well, unfortunately, this is not how God operates. In fact, with God, it is just the opposite. With God it is "You will see it when you believe it." It's all about trust. When we have a close friend that we know really well he has probably earned our trust. This gives us faith that he will do what he says he will do. It's no different with God. To trust God we need to know Him really well, and to know Him really well we need to read and understand His instruction manual. His instruction manual says that He cares for those who trust Him.

13. What will happen when I put my trust in God?

When you put your trust in God the weight of the world will be lifted off your shoulders. Having trust in God requires faith, and having faith in God is critical because without faith it is impossible to please Him. God will only reward those who earnestly seek Him. We need to study His Word to have confidence in Him and to hear Him speak to us. When you spend time reading His Word it will help strengthen your faith in Him. And when you believe in Him that is when He will start answering your prayers. At that point He will help you make your decisions based on what He is leading you to do. When we think about this level of trust we oftentimes say to ourselves "I can't do that, that's too difficult. How can I put my trust in something that I can't see?" This is a common feeling for a lot of people and it's a common roadblock to understanding who God is. But, wouldn't you know, God has a solution for you. When you accept Jesus into your heart God's Spirit, the Holy Spirit, takes up residence in your heart. And because the Holy Spirit knows you better than you know yourself He will give you all that you need, including understanding, patience, and kindness. The Holy Spirit will help you trust in and have stronger faith in God. The Holy Spirit will help catch you when you stumble, and the Holy Spirit will help you succeed where you would otherwise fail.

14. What is the secret to achieving true peace and joy?

The secret is trusting in God in everything that you do, in every major decision that you make, ²⁴⁰ not trusting in your own understanding, ²⁴¹ being still and listening for His voice, ²⁴² not being afraid, ²⁴³ not being anxious, ²⁴⁴ valuing others above yourself, ²⁴⁵ observing His commands, ²⁴⁶ relying on God when you are in trouble, ²⁴⁷ loving Him with all your heart, soul, strength, and mind, ²⁴⁸ so the Holy Spirit can teach you all things, ²⁴⁹ and give you the desires of your heart. ²⁵⁰ If you do this God will fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in Him so you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit ²⁵¹ and He will give you abundance in all things. ²⁵² Are you ready?

Chapter 5: I was made – to choose

Study Questions

1. When did God's plan start?

God's plan was put in place at the beginning of time and was kick-started in the Garden of Eden. The very moment that Adam sinned and started the downfall of the human race it was probably God's Son, Jesus, in the Garden who was there and knew that He would need to save us from our sins. If God didn't know that Adam would sin after giving him free will then God made a huge mistake, but God never makes a mistake. This means that God knew that Adam would sin, and God also knew that at the moment that Adam sinned He would need to save us from our sins. At the very moment that Adam sinned, Jesus (God in the flesh), knew that He would need to die for us. At the moment the human race was doomed - we had a Savior. It was the only way.

2. How many ways can I be saved from my sins?

There is no other way or by no other name by which one can be saved.²⁵³ ²⁵⁴ ²⁵⁵ Everyone who believes in Jesus and proclaims it will be set free from sin.²⁵⁶ This includes your past, present, and all future sins. It is by God's grace that you are saved²⁵⁷ through your faith alone. There is nothing else you can do to gain a ticket into

heaven.²⁵⁸ There is no way to earn it, or buy it. You must simply declare your faith in Jesus.²⁵⁹ God makes this gift available to everyone - but to be saved you must verbally²⁶⁰ accept His gift. You must believe in God's plan, the plan that He foretold in the Old Testament and fulfilled in the New Testament. God gives you righteousness and eternity in heaven with Him through your faith in Jesus.²⁶¹ That's it. Through Jesus your wounds will be healed.²⁶²

3. Is it smart to delay my decision?

Not making a decision - is a decision. Think about this for a moment. It might not get done if you delay your decision any longer. This is what Satan is hoping you will do. Satan is hoping that you will not accept Jesus' free gift - which means Satan still has a chance with you. Satan knows that if you accept Jesus as your Savior his opportunity to bring you to hell with him is over. Satan is already condemned but when you accept Jesus' free gift you will no longer be condemned. You will be saved. You will have opened the door of your heart and Jesus will have come in. He now wishes to share His glorious plan with you.

You are condemned until the moment that you accept Jesus as your Savior - so make your decision today.

4. What significant event happened just minutes before Jesus died?

As Jesus hung on the cross there were two other crosses next to His with criminals hanging on each. One of the criminals who hung there hurled insults at Jesus "Aren't you the Messiah? Save yourself and us!" But the second criminal rebuked him "Don't you fear God?" he said, "Since you are under the same sentence? We are being punished justly, for we are getting what our deeds deserve. But this man has done nothing wrong." Then the second criminal said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your Kingdom." Jesus replied, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with Me in paradise." Jesus, our Good Shepherd, came to save the lost. Just minutes before His death Jesus saved another of His lost sheep - the criminal who was hanging next to Him. He was a lost soul who heard and recognized God's voice. And he believed.

5. What happened the moment Jesus died?

Just before Jesus was about to die on the cross God the Father turned His eyes away from Jesus and the sins of the world were heaped on Him. ²⁶⁵ At that very moment God had to disconnect His holiness from Jesus; this was the only time this would ever happen. This is because God the Father cannot be a part of sin, any sin. In complete agony Jesus cried out "My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?" ²⁶⁶ This separation, and Jesus' proclamation as He suffered this unbelievably excruciating death, was so Jesus could bear the sins of the world. ²⁶⁷ But only those who believe in Jesus' and His death on the cross for our sins will be saved. It is the perfect plan, executed to perfection. All we need to do is believe.

6. What happened three days after Jesus was crucified, and then for the next 40 days?

On the third day after Jesus was crucified He rose from the dead and showed Himself to His disciples and hundreds of other people. This was to prove who He was - God in the flesh - and to remind us of His plan. There are many historical documents from this time period that state that people saw Jesus after He was crucified and buried. Jesus then visited various people for the next 40 days before He rose to heaven where He is today, at the right hand of God. The rose to heaven where

7. What must I do to accept Jesus' free gift?

Remember, Satan is hoping you will delay this decision. Don't delay. Do it now and your decision will be complete. Simply say the following prayer out loud and believe that Jesus came to earth to die for your sins.

Because I am a sinner, I deserve death and separation from you.

Thank you for sending Jesus to die in my place.

I trust in Jesus alone to forgive my sins and accept His gift of eternal life.

I pray that Jesus be my personal Savior and the Lord of my life.

8. How can I align my decisions with God's will?

1 Prioritize

If you believe in Jesus what are your priorities as a believer? According to Jesus the greatest commandment is to love God, and to love others. This will be a very good start to your list. You will want to make decisions that honor God and then you will want to make decisions that honor and love your family and your neighbors - as yourself. That's right, you are to love your neighbors as yourself. God loves you so He will want to support you in all that you do. He will give you choices and He will reward you for the righteous decisions that you make. In many cases there won't be right or wrong decisions, only personal preferences. Both of these are within God's perfect plan and His will for your life, and both will lead to the fulfillment of God's purpose for your life.

2 Study the Bible

Your Word is a lamp for my feet, a light on my path.²⁷⁸ When making key decisions there is a very important question that you should always ask: What does God say about it? When facing important decisions you should search the Bible and see what God says about it. It also might help to ask others as other people might have a better understanding of what the Bible says than you do. You should search the Bible because this is where God's guidance is located. All scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting, and training in righteousness.²⁷⁹ This is exactly what we need to do when making important decisions, let God's Word direct your footsteps.²⁸⁰

3 Go ahead and ask God

If you want to know what God wants, ask Him!²⁸¹ He is right here with you and me. In other words, pray. And then expect Him to answer your prayer. But don't always expect His answer to come to you directly, or right away. Oftentimes it is through someone else, or through a totally unpredictable situation, where He answers your prayer. He might speak to you through a friend, or even someone you don't know. He is very good at that. God also has an incredible sense of humor - so you may receive your answer through the weirdest of situations or circumstances. You could be at a place you have never been to before (like a gas station), at a time that you could never have planned (you just had a flat tire), surrounded by people you have never met (a bunch of teens just stopped in to buy some candy) - and BANG, your answer is given to you. When you hear God's answer be sure to praise Him for His responsiveness and His love for you. And then laugh your head off at the way He answered your prayer. He just loves doing this to people who love Him. Also be sure to ask God for wisdom.²⁸² For wisdom will enter your heart and knowledge will be pleasant to your soul.²⁸³ All godly wisdom starts with the fear of the Lord, and the fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge. Don't be a fool. Fools will despise wisdom and instruction from the Lord.²⁸⁴ God wants to guide you and help you make important decisions, and He promises to teach and instruct you through His Word.²⁸⁵ For God knows the plans that He has for you, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.²⁸⁶ Let Him guide you - through His Word.

4 Quiet yourself - and listen

Many of us pray, but we don't listen. We view prayer as one-way communication. But God can't talk to us if we are continually talking. So stop and listen. Listening is probably the most important form of communication. Learning to recognize God's voice is one of the most important aspects of a believer's life. We will continue to struggle with our decisions if we don't learn to recognize God's voice. Remember the lambs that recognize their shepherd's voice and they follow only that voice? The lambs that don't recognize their shepherd's voice - well, they know not to follow the strange voice. We need to recognize our Shepherd's voice so we aren't led in the wrong direction. For God knows that those who know Him will recognize His voice.

5 Seek Godly counsel

Plans fail for lack of counsel, but with many advisers they succeed. For the really important decisions in your life it is wise to get counsel from other godly leaders in your life. A parent, a pastor, or even a friend who is well-versed in scripture can be of immense help. They can help you remove any doubts that you have. The very last thing you should do is isolate yourself and not seek counsel. Of course, the strongest counsel you can possibly receive is from Jesus. So don't be afraid to ask Him.

6 Discern when to act

What is the wisest choice - that is the question. Use your spirit-filled mind to think through the issues and then decide on the wisest course. Through the Holy Spirit you now have wisdom that will help guide and direct you. Ask God for guidance. So, how do we know we are doing things at the right time, in God's time? God knows when the time is right. We must pray, and listen. We must be sensitive to how God may lead us. Doing things God's way will save us time, energy, and money, not to mention avoiding lots of problems.

7 Exercise your faith

We must remember that decision-making is a process that takes time. You may need to submit your will over and over to God throughout the decision-making process and then have faith and confidence that He will reveal His will to you. Commit to the LORD whatever you do and He will establish your plans for you. ²⁹² It is highly unlikely that God will reveal His plan to you if He knows that you won't obey Him. It is essential that your will is completely submitted to His will. When your will is fully submitted to God you can have confidence that He will illuminate your path. ²⁹³ Without faith it is impossible to please God. ²⁹⁴ He asks that you have faith as small as a mustard seed and then nothing will be impossible for you. ²⁹⁵

8 Learn from your mistakes

You will always make mistakes - and lots of them. But being a follower of Jesus does not exempt you from the responsibility of becoming a better decision-maker based on the mistakes that you have already made. Being a better decision-maker is not always something that you need to work on, or do. Sometimes you simply need to be quiet so God can impart His wisdom on you.²⁹⁶ When you do happen to make a mistake confess it to God and

ask Him for His forgiveness. Also, don't allow the enemy to condemn you. ²⁹⁷ ²⁹⁸ Be sure to ask God for wisdom. God wishes to impart His wisdom on you - but you need to ask for it. ²⁹⁹ When you do make a decision, and if you are blessed by the result, be sure that God gets the credit and the glory. ³⁰⁰ Also hope that others, someday, will look on your life and learn how you made wise choices that glorify God. Little by little you will gain wisdom from God's Word as you trust in Him. ³⁰¹ You will also begin to see the results reflected in your decisions.

If you love God, you will be blessed. 302 Blessed are those who fear the Lord. 303

9. If I believe in Jesus will He protect me?

Can God protect me? Absolutely! Will He protect me? Well, it depends on His will - and we may not know what is best for us. God doesn't promise us that He will protect us from all of the bad stuff that happens in the world. What He does promise is He will walk beside us during difficult times. He guarantees that He will never leave us or forsake us 304 and He will give us strength and an inner peace when we face difficult times.

Even though God has the ability to protect us from physical harm, and deliver us from trouble, it might not be His will to do so. Sometimes He uses trials and difficult circumstances to purify us. Remember, we should consider it pure joy when we face trials of many kinds. God sometimes tests our faith in order to develop a higher level of faith by allowing us to grow through trials so we can persevere and grow to maturity. When this is the case, protecting us from trials would not be beneficial to us. When God allows suffering in our life, it is almost always an opportunity to strengthen our trust in Him. The case is a suffering in our life, it is almost always an opportunity to strengthen our trust in Him.

10. Why does God bless His people?

There is one over-arching reason why God blesses His people. It is so they can bring glory to His name. He also blesses and gifts certain people so they can serve and bless others. But for God to bless us we must be obedient to His Word. God repeatedly promises us that He will bless us abundantly so we will abound in all good works. For Him to fulfill that promise we must truly believe that He will. God's promises may seem impossible to you, but for God who has created the universe, the earth, all living creatures, as well as you and me - nothing is impossible. God promises to give you the desires of your heart but you must ask Him for it. You do not receive because you do not ask.

Job 33:33 If not, listen to me. Hold your peace, and I will teach you wisdom.

11. Does God hear and respond to every prayer?

There is no doubt that Jesus hears every prayer - whether the person believes in Jesus or not. God is omniscient, which means He hears and sees everything that happens on earth. Is there any place on earth where you could possibly hide where God will not hear your prayer? The answer is No. Everything you do, and think, is laid bare before the eyes of the One to whom you must give account someday. Everything. So nobody should have any doubt that God hears all prayers.

Jesus not only hears the prayers from those who believe in Him, He answers them - but not always in the way that we want, or in the way that we ask. He tells believers to boldly approach His throne so He can help us in our time of need. But, this doesn't mean that the answer to your prayer will always be a Yes. Sometimes it will be No. And sometimes - well, the answer may be something very different than what you expected. This is because Jesus knows what you need far better than you do. The nice thing about our prayers is Jesus knows our intentions. We don't need to use any fancy words. If our intentions aren't right with Him, He will see right through it. He knows whether answering a prayer will be good for everyone, or not. He knows whether satisfying a prayer will further His kingdom, or not. He knows whether satisfying a prayer will allow us to serve or bless others, or not. This means that not all of our prayers are consistent with His will so some of our prayers may go without an answer. They will be overruled.

12. Who does God bless?

In Matthew 5 it says ¹Now when Jesus saw the crowds, He went up on a mountainside and sat down. His disciples came to him, ²and He began to teach them. He said:

³Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

⁴Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.

⁵Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.

⁶Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.

⁷Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.

⁸Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.

⁹Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.

¹⁰Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

¹¹Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of Me.

13. What are some reasons why God doesn't give His blessings?

It's possible that you are not receiving God's blessings because you are not committed to God and His teachings. In the eyes of the Lord you might be considered lukewarm. When things are going well, you ignore Him. And then when something bad happens in your life you cry out to Him. You are cold, then warm, then cold, then warm, and since you don't trust in Him for every major decision in your life - how can He trust you? God needs your commitment. He needs to know where you stand and whether you trust in His standards and are willing to live by His standards. Having a lack of commitment to God and His standards is probably the biggest problem in our society today. Everybody seems to want everything and they will do whatever it takes get it, including lying, cheating, being dishonest, and even if it means getting ahead at the expense of others.

Many people seem to be living a life without having any real commitments, or even standards. Many people will say what they believe you want to hear with no moral thought as to what they are actually saying. They will say they believe in God, yet they don't live according to His standards. They will pick and choose God's standards that they like, and disobey the rest - as if these "other" standards don't mean anything. A person will get married and then shortly thereafter file for divorce. They will attend church and as they leave the church parking lot they will cut somebody off and shake their fist. This is a grievous and non-committed lifestyle that God abhors. God needs your commitment. If you are not 100% for God and committed to His principles then you are against Him. As you can imagine if you are not living a committed lifestyle where God can trust you, you will not receive His blessings.

If you always do and say things that please the crowd, instead of doing what is right, God will know that He can't depend on you to make the right decision when He needs it the most. If He can't depend on you why would He risk blessing you with things that might go to waste? God might test your faith to see if you can be trusted. Testing your faith is how God finds out whether He can depend on you through thick and thin, through troubles and difficulties, through pain and suffering, through failures and frustration, and so much more.

Ask God to help you align your mind and your heart with His mind and His heart. Admit your moral bankruptcy and ask God to forgive you for your sins. Ask for wisdom. Instead of relying on your own strength turn your life over to Jesus and rely on His strength. When you are weary you will find rest for your soul through God. 327

1. When was "my mission" put in place?

God has had His plan in place for you before you were born. The life you have lived, and the problems that you have experienced, have not come about by accident. It is all part of God's grand plan. Your birth and your future were all ordained. All the days of your life were written in God's book before even one came to be including who your parents would be, when and where you would be born, where you would live, what you would look like, who your friends would be, and the different experiences - both good and bad - that you would live through. These were all planned by God for a very specific purpose. Even all of the bad experiences that you have lived through have been for a reason. All of your experiences have been for your spiritual growth.

Psalms 139:15 My frame wasn't hidden from you, when I was made in secret, woven together in the depths of the earth.

³²⁹ Psalms 139:16 Your eyes saw my body. In your book they were all written, the days that were ordained for me, when as yet there were none of them.

2. Did God come to earth to save my body, my spirit, or both?

Our spirit is the reason why He came to earth. God didn't come to earth to die on the cross to save our earthly bodies. He came to earth to save our soul, which is our spirit. Our bodies are just temporary; our bodies are weak and will always be full of problems. Some of our weaknesses are by God's design. Our bodies will continue to fail us as they haven't been designed for eternity, but our spirit has been designed for eternity. It is our spirit that provides a guarantee of what is yet to come.

The longing in our heart to find out who we are and why we were born starts a new direction in our life. We were all made for a mission, but God leaves it up to each of us to find out what it is. God gives us His Holy Spirit to live within us³³² to help us find the answer to this important question. But for God's Holy Spirit to help us we must believe that God came to earth in the form of Jesus to die for our sins. This is the only way that God can help us.

3. Learning God's will for my life - will it be easy?

Understanding God's will for your life is not something that will be handed to you on a silver platter. It's going to take some work. But God wants you to know His will. He isn't hiding it from you. You must start by not conforming to the things of this world. Remember, Satan has control and dominion over the world in which we live - which means if you continue to listen to the messages "the world" sends your way you are basically agreeing to conform to Satan's schemes, his deceptions, his devices, and his destructive messages, which are many. If you continue to conform to his way and his messages you will be walking into his trap and you will be walking down his path, and we know where that path leads. 334 It leads to darkness.

God wants everyone to find the purpose and mission that He has ordained for them. Unfortunately, not everyone will. Not everyone will find it, or even seek it. It is your own personal responsibility to discover God's will for your life. Nobody else can do this for you. To find it, you must seek it. How do you find something if you don't look for it? It is the seeking that requires work. The best way to do this is to read what He is telling you in His instruction manual - the Bible. This book is meant to give you some insight into what the Bible says, but the Bible will be 1000 times more thorough. The Bible is His full and accurate Word.

³³⁰ John 9:1 As he passed by, he saw a man blind from birth. 2 His disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" 3 Jesus answered, "Neither did this man sin, nor his parents; but, that the works of God might be revealed in him."

³³¹ 2 Corinthians 1:22 who also sealed us, and gave us the down payment of the Spirit in our hearts.

³³² Romans 8:27 He who searches the hearts knows what is on the Spirit's mind, because he makes intercession for the saints according to God.

Romans 12:2 Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will.

³³⁴ Matthew 7:13 Enter in by the narrow gate; for wide is the gate and broad is the way that leads to destruction, and many are those who enter in by it. 14 How narrow is the gate, and restricted is the way that leads to life! Few are those who find it.

4. What is the most important decision that anyone can make?

The decision is incredibly simple - it's simply to believe. Believe in Jesus. You must believe that God so loved the world that He sent His only Son, Jesus, to earth to save you from your sins, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life. Can you say easy? But you must do this one thing. God is watching. He created you and He is watching for your commitment. He came to earth to die for you, and because of what He did for you - He needs to know that you believe in Him. He needs to know that you are committed. Until you are committed, and until He knows that you believe in Him, He can't help you.

His plan was perfect. It was a plan that was already in place when Adam sinned. God's plan means that we all have a Savior. But to be saved we must believe. It was, and is, the perfect plan, developed by a perfect God, executed to perfection. We just need to believe. Jesus is the fabric of God's grand plan³³⁶ and Jesus is the fabric of His beautiful design. Jesus is also the thread through which we can reach the top of the rug.

5. How can I learn God's will for my life?

It all starts with the Word of God since God's Word is His will. Don't be foolish and not try to understand God's will for your life. ³³⁸ The chief purpose for our life is to live according to His will, and when you live according to His will there will be a supernatural peace and a supernatural joy that will come into your life. This is also when God's blessings can begin to flow into your life - when you live according to His standards and do what He has called you to do. ³³⁹ ³⁴⁰

There isn't a special process that you must follow to discover God's will for your life. His plan is practical, not mystical. You must simply desire to live a life that is connected with His and live a life that aligns with His standards. This will start the process of spiritual discovery. Simply follow His Word and immerse your life in a desire for discovery. When you do this God will begin to reveal the answers that you seek. When you open your heart, pray and ask for answers and you will begin to see and understand revelations that He gives you. Simply ask Him and He will provide. It is God's Holy Spirit that has taken up residence in your heart that will give you a level of understanding and knowledge that you desire. 341

6. How do I recognize God's blessings?

Don't feel disheartened if you don't understand God's will for your life and answers to your prayers don't jump out at you the moment that you start your journey. The answers to your prayers will probably come to you over time-like taking a long stroll through the woods. The longer you walk, and the more alert you are, the more you will see. During your search be sure to walk slowly because God's treasures and His answers are behind every plant, under every rock, in every tree, and in every stream. Also be sure to watch the beautiful clouds that are rolling by as you walk.

God's treasures and His blessings come in many different forms. To recognize God's blessings you need to be on alert, and when you are, His blessings will speak to you. Too many times we walk so fast that we miss seeing His blessings. This can happen if we let the world consume our lives. One of Satan's goals is to blind us with work, TV, computers, magazines, and other "stuff" so we don't see or experience God's blessings, or even experience God. Satan does not want us to experience God so Satan will do everything he can to keep us walking too fast so we don't experience God's will for our life. Slow down and resist Satan's "busy"-ness and he will flee from you. As you take your walk trust that the Lord will reveal more of His will to you. Be confident that He who began a good work in you will carry it to completion. For God's purpose is that His son Jesus will be glorified and that His Good News in the Bible will be communicated throughout the world.

7. Are my natural abilities and my talents God's will for my life?

A mistake that many of us make is assuming that whatever we are "good" at - that this is God's will for my life. We assume that if we are really good at something it must mean that God wants us to use that to further His kingdom. This might be true, but we should not assume that this is the case. God has given each of us unique skills and abilities and talents, which is wonderful, but if we only focus on these things while we search for God's will for our life we might miss something extremely important. We need to lean on God. We need to lean on Him to sustain us in all areas of our life. 347 348 349 350 351 352 God's will includes having a relationship with Him, connecting with Him, needing Him, following Him, 353 and living a life according to His standards.

Proverbs 6:22 When you walk, it will lead you. When you sleep, it will watch over you. When you awake, it will talk with you.

8. How will I "short-circuit" learning God's will for my life?

When we are really good at something, when we are so good that we don't feel like we need any of God's help, this is when we might short-circuit what God desires for us. God's will for us is so much more than focusing on our talents and our natural abilities. God wants us to have faith in Him. God wants us to accomplish things that we could never accomplish without Him. When we accomplish something that we could never accomplish without Him (e.g., like writing this book and this study guide) it strengthens our faith in Him and we will overflow with thankfulness.³⁵⁴

God's will for our life is so much more than our occupation and our talents and our natural abilities. Our goal must be to live a life that is pleasing to God and to allow the Holy Spirit within us to help guide our daily decisions. For the Lord says, He will bless those who follow Him. 355 356 God wants all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of His truth. When you trust in Him and lean not on your own understanding He will make your path straight. 358

9. What will happen if I live according to God's will?

When you live according to God's will and if you work to fulfill your purpose God will provide you with a supernatural peace and joy in your life. ³⁵⁹ ³⁶⁰ ³⁶¹ This is God's gift to you, that you may be blessed, so you can bless others. His gift will include a confidence in everything that you do. ³⁶² God will also help you make key decisions in your life, decisions that will be easier and clearer - which will give you additional peace.

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart; and lean not unto your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths." - Proverbs 3:5-6

But this doesn't mean that you will never have hardships or difficulties in your life; you will have problems. As a believer in Jesus you can delight in your weakness, hardships, persecutions, and difficulties - for when you are weak you can be strong. As you persevere you will receive what He has promised you. For Jesus has won the war. The war is over. Jesus has overcome the world. The true joy in your life will be finding God's will for your life. Keep God's Word as your foundation and watch His plan unfold right before your very eyes. This is when you will start to receive some hints as to what the top of the rug looks like.

10. The spiritual gifts the Lord gives me – are they for my benefit?

It is important to understand that whatever gift God has given to you, it is not meant for you. Your gift is meant to be given away. Your gift is meant to benefit others in your service to them. Your gift is not for your own pleasure. Another way of saying this is: your gift is for God's glory, not for your own glory. When you use your gift to serve others you are bringing about the unity of the body of Christ, and when the body of Christ is in unity you will help stimulate spiritual growth within the body's members.

11. What are some of the spiritual gifts that I might receive?

In alphabetical order (not a complete list...):

- 1. The gift of Administration the gift of planning and directing
- 2. The gift of Art & Artistry the gift of creating artistic expressions of things
- 3. The gift of Discernment the gift of knowing what is right and wrong and knowing God's will
- 4. The gift of Evangelism the gift that moves believers to reach nonbelievers so they may become active members of the Christian community
- 5. The gift of <u>Encouragement</u> /<u>Exhortation</u> the gift that moves believers to reach out with love to people in conflict or facing a problem
- 6. The gift of Faith the gift that gives believers the eyes to see the Spirit at work within them
- 7. The gift of <u>Giving</u> the gift that enables a believer to recognize God's blessings and to respond by being generous with time and talent
- 8. The gift of Healing the gift that allows a believer to use the healing power of the Lord
- 9. The gift of Hospitality the gift that moves a believer to welcome and receive guests, especially those in need
- 10. The gift of <u>Intercession</u> the gift that enables a believer to pray with the certainty that their prayer will be heard
- 11. The gift of <u>Knowledge</u> the gift that drives a person to fully understand the Bible's teachings and the promises outlined in the Bible
- 12. The gift of Leadership the gift that gives a believer the confidence to fully prepare for the future

12. Do I get to choose my spiritual gift?

You don't get to choose which gift you get as God chooses it for you. The only choice that you get is to unwrap it and use it. The gift that you receive is a God-given assignment and a desire for you to perform a specific function within the body of Christ. Your gift is given to you along with a supernatural energy that will make your service to others effortless and joyful. You will use your gift to serve others and you will love doing it! Don't worry you will be happy with the gift that you receive. 368

13. Why should we pray?

God already knows what we need and want so why should we pray? Is it because we think God doesn't know what we need? Is it because we think God doesn't know we are hurting? Or maybe we think that He will give us a special favor or dispensation if we solemnly ask Him in prayer?

The answer is: true prayer is asking in faith. We must pray and ask that His will be done. God wants us to ask for things. When we ask God for things we are expressing our dependence on Him and we are acknowledging that He is in control. We are acknowledging that He knows what we need and that we need His involvement. We want His involvement. Prayer is faith in action. Prayer is knocking on His door and through faith in Him we know He will open the door and give us what we ask for. When we align with His will, and obey His commands, we will know He will bless us and that He will set us high above the nations on earth.

But, just because God knows what we need, this surely doesn't mean that we should stop asking Him. We should pray because we wish to align with His will. We should pray because we wish to deepen our relationship with Him. God says that He will help transform us so we can know His will. Let's repeat this very important point - through prayer and dependence on Him our minds will be transformed so we can know His will.

14. Why it is so hard to tell others about our faith, or about Jesus?

Trying to describe Jesus to other people without fully understanding His plan, and everything He did to fulfill His plan, is like trying to describe someone by only reading their obituary. It can't be done. Is there anyone who can describe a person they never knew? To describe someone we need to know what they said, what they did, what was important to them, what they stood for, how they cared for others, what they believed in, and so much more.

The same is true for many of us when someone brings up the topic of Jesus in conversation, or the topic of faith. We get nervous. Our heart rate jumps. We want to change the subject. But it shouldn't be this way. We need to understand what God did for us and be comfortable talking about it.

- 5. If you are ashamed to talk about Him, He will be ashamed of you when His is glorified. 377
- 6. Because telling others is one of the fruits of the Spirit. 378
- 7. Because telling others is a wise thing to do. 379
- 8. Because telling others will help them from going to Hell. 380
- 9. Because telling others will please God. 381
- 10. Because telling others provides fellowship with God. 382
- 11. Because telling others will make the angels rejoice. 383
- 12. Because telling others will help provide more workers for the harvest of finding more un-saved souls. 384

16. Can I make a difference in the world when I am so incredibly small?

Yes! Listen to the song. Every single one of us can reach someone, people that we know, and people that we don't see very often - maybe some of your neighbors, shut-ins, acquaintances, casual friends, and others. Together we can all reach everyone. All we need to believe is that we can be a spark, a spark that starts a flame, a flame that starts a fire, a fire that cannot be consumed. This fire can travel the world, to every person, if we believe.

18. What is our mission while here on earth?

Our mission while on earth is summarized in The Lord's Prayer: (Matthew 6)

⁹"This, then, is how you should pray: 'Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, ¹⁰your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven, ¹¹Give us this day our daily bread. ¹²And forgive us our debts, as we also forgive our debtors. ¹³And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one."

Do you see in verse 10 where it says that our mission is to help bring God's kingdom to earth? Our eternal salvation is guaranteed the moment that we put our faith in Jesus, but the quality of our life while here on earth depends on carrying out God's plan after our salvation. It is through our obedience to His Word, and leaving our former way of life behind, that our eyes will be opened to our glorious inheritance. This will require that we continue to grow in our knowledge of Jesus which requires that we study the Bible so we will not be ashamed when we are provided with an opportunity to tell others. Our persistent learning of God's Word will enlarge our capacity for loving, forgiving, joy, and happiness, and it will also give us the ability to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ and that His love surpasses all knowledge.

- 5. Honor God in all that you do obey His standards. 395

20. What will happen when I decide to follow Jesus?

God must trust you before His blessings will flow. And you must trust God that He will show you more of His plan when He is ready. God isn't going to show you everything all at once, but God does have a plan for you and it might take some time to find out what that is. Someday you will get to see the top of the rug and it is going to be exquisite. Your life will shine within His glorious design.

Bible References

Many different Bible translations were considered for inclusion in this book. Unfortunately, most of the translations, including the NIV, NKJV, NASV, RSV, NRSV, NAB, and several others, are copyrighted and require royalty payments to reference their verses in mass (like in this book; we have approximately 700 verses within our footnotes in this book). For us to blanket the world with our book, and to keep our eBook free and our paperback cost as low as possible, we could not incur the cost of these royalty payments. Many of these translations are very good - but they become too expensive when trying to blanket the world with hundreds of thousands and possibly millions of book. Therefore, we had to make the difficult decision to use a royalty-free version of the Bible in our footnote references. The translation that we chose is a free and updated version of the American Standard Version (1901) called the World English Bible. The ASV was, and is, considered to be a very reliable and honest translation of the Bible. New American Standard Bible (NASB) verses are also referenced in this book and the NASB has a liberal use clause which allows us to reference up to 500 verses without written permission and without needing to pay royalty payments. If you have any questions about any of the verses/references that we used within this book we recommend that you cross-reference it with the Bible translation that you prefer to see what your translation says. We are not for, or against, any translation, we simply want to get this message out to the entire world - without paying royalties - so everyone in the world can learn about Jesus and understand God's will for their life.
